



Thursday, August 10, 6:00-8:00 pm (Special time!) OPWDD/SN: Accessing Preschool Special Education Services

Early childhood providers are usually the first ones to recognize developmental issues in young children. This session will review developmental expectations and possible red flags signaling potential delays. Monday, October 16, 6:30-8:30 pm—The Truth about Adverse Childhood Experiences: Our Role in Responding to Child Abuse

Young children are in many ways defenseless and require adult protection and nurturing. Adverse childhood experiences create a high risk of negative outcomes later in life. Learn about these risks and how to address child abuse and maltreatment when we suspect it. Discuss OCFS statutes and regulations related to child abuse as well as how we can respond to and prevent child abuse so as to assure the safety of children in our care. A review of Shaken Baby Syndrome will also be included.

Tuesday, November 7, 6:30-9:00 pm—Emergency Medication Administration Overview INCLUDING Stock Epinephrine Auto-Injectors (Special time!)

This 2.5-hour course provides specific instruction on safely administering emergency medication to children in child care programs. "Emergency medication" refers to patient-specific epinephrine auto-injectors, diphenhydramine in combination with the epinephrine auto-injector, asthma inhalers and nebulizers, in accordance with the New York State child care regulations for each modality of care. This training also includes the administration of non-patient-specific stock epinephrine auto-injectors in accordance with §3000-c of the Public Health Law, and satisfies the New York State Department of Health training requirement for that use.



FOR ALL FAMILY/GROUP FAMILY, CHILD CARE CENTER, LEGALLY EXEMPT, AND SCHOOL AGE CHILD CARE STAFF

Did you know that federal law requires all staff in family and group family programs, child care centers, legally exempt, and school age centers, including volunteers, to complete health and safety training before September 30, 2017? HERE ARE FOUR WAYS TO MEET THIS NEW REQUIREMENT

1) FAMILY AND GROUP FAMILY CHILD CARE PROVIDERS + CENTERS AND SCHOOL AGE PROGRAMS: Take the free 5 hour Foundation of Health & Safety e-learning (online) course offered through The Early Childhood Professional Development Program (PDP).* This is also one option for employees hired after September 30, 2017.

Medication Administration Training (MAT)

MAT Classroom Course

This eight hour course is taught in the classroom over two days. A written test is given the last day of the class.

Registration and Payment

Certificates for Seminars and ARC Trainings
